- •The Racial Equity Fund will offer grants up to \$10,000 each for projects that seek to address equity gaps for communities of color in the following areas:
 - Education and job readiness
 - Criminal justice system
 - Community leadership and development
 - Income and wealth creation within communities of color
 - Racial and cultural education
 - Health and wellness within communities of color



How Racial Equity Grant Program Works

- 1. Applicants get familiar with application online at https://yccf.org/for-grant-seekers/grant-programs/
- If needed, applicants can email committee at <u>racialequitygrants@yccf.org</u> to ask questions
- 3. Contact Roth Preap rpreap@yccf.org if you need help setting up an online account to submit your application or have questions about the application form
- 4. Applicants apply online by October 8th, 2021
- 5. Committee will follow-up with applicants if needed
- Committee evaluates applications & recommends grants to YCCF Board of Directors for approval
- 7. Grant awards are announced.



Grantee Eligibility

- Must be classified as a 501(c) (3) public charity under the Internal Revenue Code (this does not apply to government agencies or public school districts).
- Individuals can reach out to committee members to discuss their proposal and may be connected to a charitable fiscal sponsor who can serve as a sponsor for the application.
- Must provide services in York County.

Grants are NOT provided for:

- Endowments, budget shortfalls, debt retirement or association dues.
- Sectarian religious programs.
- Organizations with discriminatory employment or program practices.
- Direct financial assistance to individuals.
- Reimbursement for programs, programs or items purchased before grant is awarded.

Fiscal Sponsors

- If you are applying for charitable work but are not a nonprofit, you must have a fiscal sponsor manage your grant funding.
- Recommended fiscal sponsors:
 - YWCA York
 - Downtown Inc
 - Crispus Attucks
 - White Rose Leadership Institute

This list above is a recommendation, you are welcome to select your own fiscal sponsor, and YCCF will pay up to 5% to that nonprofit to act in this capacity.

Grant Reports

- The committee will want to know how the project/program went and will request a final report after the project is completed
- Any report forms will be on grant portal and be emailed to the grantees at the end of the grant period
- Things we will look for:
 - Did you achieve what you wanted to achieve and if not, what were the obstacles?
 - Describe with details, how you would define your positive impact on diverse communities who have participated in your service/program?
 - One reflection or lesson learned



What do we ask in the Grant Application?

I. Introduction*

- Please list your group/organization's mission and a brief history as it relates to this grant. Explain who will be involved and what is their experience in this work
- Character Limit: 1000

II. Please Summarize Your Grant Request

- Include key activities and numbers/information about people served.
- Character Limit: 1000

III. What Will Your Grant Achieve?

- Describe how your program/project will impact the lives of the people/communities served. Explain if and how you plan to continue this program after the end of the grant period.
- Character Limit: 1000

IV. How Will You Measure Your Achievement? How Will You Know That You've Been Successful?

- Explain how you will know when your program/project has completed its planned goal. Explain how you will measure it.
- Character Limit: 1000

V. Are You Partnering/Collaborating With Any Other Groups/Organizations?

- If so, please explain.
- Character Limit: 1000

VI. Budget

- Please upload a budget detailing your grant program. You may use the YCCF budget template (found here) or use your own. Please be sure your budget includes itemized expenditures and income streams, including other funders for your program.
- File Size Limit: 2 MB





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
